Bikerday at the Capitol. It is scheduled for Wednesday, January 20th.

The talking points are as follows;

Improve Funding for Motorcycle Training and Motorist Awareness.

Due to a reduction in the number of new riders and the aging of the motorcycling demographic, training class enrolment in Minnesota is declining. Some training facilities find that rider training classes are not able to operate at a cost-effective level. The result of this could be closing or consolidating some rider training locations, adding additional travel distance for many students. In an attempt to reduce the risk of a diminished rider training product, A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota will propose small fee increases in motorcycle permit applications and license renewals. The permit fee will rise a few dollars and the license renewal fee to keep your motorcycle endorsement on your driver's license will rise from \$13 per renewal to \$17 per renewal. This fee is paid every four years when a driver's license is renewed. While the dollar amounts are small, multiplied by the 420,000 people who have this endorsement will mean that motorcycle rider training will continue to be a local option. This proposal will also benefit motorist awareness of motorcyclist programs and available motorcycle rider training.

No Change to the Motorcycle Helmet Law.

The motorcyclists of Minnesota ask that you continue to support the current Minnesota motorcycle helmet law, which requires those under 18 and those on a learner permit to wear a helmet while allowing endorsed adults the choice to wear or not to wear a helmet while operating a motorcycle. No helmet on the market can prevent a crash. The best way to prevent injuries is to prevent crashes. Crash avoidance and holding those who use our roadways accountable for their actions are the key factors for injury prevention.

Oppose Mandatory Uninsured and Underinsured Insurance Requirements for Minnesota Motorcvclists.

These bills would require all Minnesota motorcyclists to carry uninsured and underinsured insurance. This is opposed by a broad coalition of Minnesota motorcyclists. There are many insurance options in addition to the liability requirements that may be of benefit to a motorcycle rider, but these policy additions should be the motorcyclist's option. Most riders already have uninsured and underinsured insurance but the extra cost of this insurance could make motorcycle riding too expensive for some, especially younger, riders. Additionally, the passage of this legislation may have unintended consequences. Riders who face large increases in motorcycle insurance may choose to not purchase insurance at all.

Pray for the best, prepare for the worse, and expect the Unexpected.

NCOM (NATIONAL COALITION OF MOTORCYCLISTS) REPORT OCTOBER 2020

Last month I mentioned the discussion at our recent NCOM convention titled. "Protect your Rights in Motorcycle Accidents" I mentioned legislation pending in at least one state. The following comments are taken from NCOM BIKER NEWSBYTES Compiled & Edited by Bill Bish:

"MICHIGAN MOTORCYCLISTS PROTEST UNFAIR INSURANCE LAW

Riders in Michigan now risk having an accident with a driver who chose to cap their own medical benefits at a level less than the amount the injured motorcyclist actually incurs in medical expenses. A.B.A.T.E. of Michigan members and supporters gathered on the capitol steps in September to protest the state's new automobile insurance law that limits access to lifetime medical benefits available to motorcyclists to how much coverage the car driver chose to purchase for themselves.

Previously, motorcyclists involved in an accident with an at-fault car driver would have their medical bills covered under the state's no-fault system, known as personal injury protection coverage or PIP. But motorcyclists no longer have the same coverages under a new law designed to drive down auto insurance rates -- routinely ranked among the highest in the nation -- by allowing motorists to purchase policies with limited personal injury protection benefits.

State Senator Peter Lucido (R-Macomb

County) introduced legislation to rectify this dangerous defect in the system by allowing motorcyclists to file a claim against their own insurance policy."

I would also like to share information I have since received from an A.B.A.T.E. of MN member. This member was involved in a car/motorcycle crash. The driver of the car was at fault and that driver's insurance company paid out the limits of the policy for the injured motorcyclists' medical expenses. Unfortunately, the insurance payout fell far short of the total medical costs. Now what? Seek recovery from the assets of the auto driver. Sorry the driver was a young driver and had virtually no assets.

This situation is not fully resolved yet but currently the motorcyclists is being held responsible for several hundreds of thousands of dollars of medical expenses. The motorcyclist has been left with serious injuries limiting their ability to work. How will this motorcyclist protect their personal assets? That is yet to be determined.

Following the convention, I have asked many people if they have adequate insurance and they have replied "I have full coverage." When asked what the limits of their policy was many stated "I have no idea but I think it's enough." I would like to encourage all of our members to have a serious look at your insurance. Look at coverage amounts and possible exclusions that may be listed in the policy. I would also suggest taking the time to visit with an attorney and talk about how to best protect yourself and your assets if involved in a crash.

As always be vigilant, protect yourself from the carelessness of others.

MOTORCYCLE SAFETY TASK FORCE

As I write this, in the second week of December, I have seen two or three motorcycles out on the highways every day this week. What a strange year 2020 has been!!!

The last information that I have received is that 61 motorcyclists were killed in 59 crashes in 2020. That compares to 44 in 2019, and 58 in 2018.

I received two motorcycle license renewals in the mail and in each one there was a slip of paper that the task force voted to put in there. Our goal was to encourage rider training for motorcyclists. I am really happy that the insert mentions counter-steering as 25 of the fatality crashes in 2020 were motorcyclists trying to negotiate a curve.

Our last task force meeting was November 19th, and as we are getting used to, we attended by using our phones and computers. Steve Haataja talked about the rider training programs for last year and the up to the plate at your March meeting, they will be a "write in."

This allows for all people voting absentee time for them to get their ballots, vote, get them back to me and then get them back to the Chapter Presidents to be included with their March ballots. Please do not call me past this date to request them.

upcoming year. He said about 100 courses were cancelled due to COVID in April and May. The remaining courses for the year were full. Hopefully courses can start in April this year as scheduled. Many students had to cancel their training as they couldn't get their permit because of closures at permit sites.

At our next meeting, we will again discuss what messages we would like to see on the electric sign boards on the state's freeways. The message boards are two or three lines and there is room for 18 to 22 letters and spaces per line. I have thought about this for years and I still haven't come up with the perfect phase. Something short and simple like: "CLICK IT OR TICKET." But I don't want something that's brainwashing, like: "SEAT BELTS SAVE LIVES - SO DO MASKS." Here's some MRF news. Bikers in Europe are facing the threat of losing their old motorcycles. The European Union has "end of life" vehicle directives. The directives mean you can't park the old Dodge truck with the blown engine behind your shed to part out someday. It is supposed to be "transferred to authorized treatment facilities to be demolished in an environmentally friendly way." Is this a five-step program? Do I need a sponsor? The Federation of European Motorcyclists Associations (FEMA) is fighting to keep motorcycles excluded from these directives.

Back in the USA, the MRF may be siding with automakers. In December the Federal Communications Commission voted 5-0 to give part of the radio frequency spectrum, that was reserved for carmakers for the past 20 years, to cable companies instead. This spectrum space was to be used for emerging technology in vehicle to vehicle communications, crash avoidance systems and smart highway designs to make roads safer for all users. The MRF added spectrum band issues to their 2021 priorities list.
